


Roughly 90% of children happily look forward to going to school

My child is learning how to be a good member of society through their daily routine and play.







The Top 11 New Subjects you want introduced






Environmental Hygiene Satisfaction





For example, it has allowed him to expand his horizons at an early age, not only in English, but also in geography, the ecosystem, the arts, and science.




